The Smiling Bus Project

The Smiling Bus concept was first introduced in a team meeting by Mumbai Smiles' creator and director, Jaume Sir. Following this discussion, the education project manager and I got down and chatted about the Bus concept. We both agreed that the concept was excellent and realistic, and it was a lovely project to work on. There were numerous hurdles to overcome, such as gathering bus information, logistical efforts, and coordinating with various vendors and agencies for the bus quotation. Also, what will the Bus's design and structure be?

After much research and coordination, Mumbai Smiles founder and Director Jaume Sir officially launched the Smiling Bus in the Bhandup community on October 16, 2019. The goal of the Smiling Bus Project is to prevent and raise awareness about

Working with Street Children: Working with street children is a sensitive and difficult endeavor that takes commitment and understanding. Street children are young people who end up living and working on the streets due to a combination of poverty, familial troubles, or other adversity. Understanding the various dynamics that lead to street children is critical for effective treatment with them. Some of the root causes are poverty, family breakdowns, abuse, addiction, and displacement. Recognizing these challenges aids in the development of suitable interventions

Empathy and Trust-Building: It was important to build trust while working with these groups Building trust is the foundation of any successful intervention, because these groups may have experienced rejection and trauma, making it essential to approach them with empathy and non-judgmental attitudes. Gaining their trust took a time-consuming process but finally, I built trust and confidence with them.

Education and Skill Development: Access to basic education and life skill empowerment sessions was vital for street children's long-term prospects. These sessions and holistic approaches offer them a chance to break the cycle of poverty and reintegrate into society.

Healthcare and Counseling: Many street children face health issues, both physical and mental. Hence, we conducted regular healthcare checkups, and counseling, to help them address these concerns and improve their overall well-being.

Advocacy and Children Core Committee: Advocacy is crucial to addressing the systemic issues that contribute to the presence of street children. Through the Children Core Committee and Child Parliament, we try to connect with the local government bodies, so these groups can raise their own issues and community issues.

Prevention and Awareness: Preventing and creating awareness about human trafficking children through awareness sessions, life skills sessions, and Library on Wheels In conclusion, working with street children is a challenging task that requires a holistic approach. It's about not only meeting immediate needs but also addressing the root causes and providing opportunities for these vulnerable young individuals to lead fulfilling lives within the safety and security of a supportive community.

The Library on Wheels and I

I've been with Mumbai Smiles as a Field Coordinator for over five years, and I've been a part of the Smiling Bus initiative since its inception. Previously, I spent three years working with organizations like as Majlis to combat human trafficking and domestic violence against women. I have worked as a team member with CHILDLINE 1098 and in the field of Child Rights and Child Protection for over fifteen years.

We began working on the Smiling Bus initiative at areas such as Borivali Railway Station, Wadala Railway Station, Shaym Nagar Bhandup, and Wadi Bandar, While interacting with the street children, we discovered that they are unable to read and write in accordance with their age and grade level, making them educationally quite backward. The grounds behind this are that they do not attend school on a regular basis. When we looked into it further, we discovered that they are striking because they do not have enough water to take a bath, thus other pupils in the school, as well as the teacher, are not expecting them and are not paying attention to their development.

As a result, the Smiling Bus team devised a solution to establish the "Library on Wheels" project, which was inaugurated on May 6, 2022, at Shyam Nagar Bhandup in the presence of Founder Director Mr. Jaume sir, and we also invited some of the officers from Pratham Mumbai who have supported us in building this project by assisting Smiling Bus staff, providing training, and books. The team is inspiring street children to build the habit of book reading from the most basic to the most advanced level, and as their reading level advances, the team will support them in strengthening their writing skills. So, with the intention of enhancing children's reading and writing habits through outreach, to a wide number of neighborhood youngsters, as well as guaranteeing that each child is protected from trafficking.

Currently, the Library on Wheels activity is operational at all five Smiling Bus locations: Jai Bhim Nagar Powai, Shaym Nagar Bhandup, Wadala Railway Station, Chheda Nagar Ghatkopar, Kannamwar Nagar Vikhroli, and an experimental library at Keni Vidyalaya in Bhandup. Every week, we reach out to around 750 youngsters through the project.

Under the project, the team conducts home visits to collect information about children and their families, as well as to assess their level of reading and writing by administering pre-tests and categorizing children into low, basic, mid, and high reading levels, and then providing them with books to read while tracking their progress.

While working on this project, I had a variety of experiences. During the

Corona time, we saw that youngsters had lost their passion for reading and had become more habituated to mobile phones and reading. So, you must either sit with each child individually or gather a group of four or five children and read the book with them.

We formed a core committee in each area; this is the core committee that will reach out to every family via the library. So, are we going to create parent committees or community awareness programs to combat human trafficking? Of course, the Library on Wheels will reach every household in the community, and we will endeavor to eliminate human trafficking.


